Dear Director Kilroy:

I represent the Third Way Center, an organization that assists high risk and disadvantaged adolescents and their families. Our organization currently holds a Denver-issued child care center license for our facility at 1133 Lincoln St., Denver, CO. After a productive meeting with potential DCA applicant, Ms. Cindy Sovine-Miller, it is my understanding that Section 3.02(b) of the Denver Department of Excise and Licenses ("Denver EXL") Rules Governing Marijuana DCAs may prohibit Ms. Sovine-Miller from applying for a DCA permit for the property located at 1244 Grant St., Denver, CO, due to the proximity of our facility at 1133 Lincoln Street. It appears that our 1133 Lincoln Street location is approximately 980 feet from 1244 Grant St.

The Third Way Center does not believe that Ms. Sovine-Miller's proposed DCA at 1244 Grant St. poses a risk to our tenants at 1133 Lincoln St., which is located several blocks away. We therefore respectfully request that you waive or otherwise exempt Ms. Sovine-Miller's DCA application from this proximity restriction as it relates to our 1133 Lincoln Street location.
