

AB 3	Cooper	Cannabis Sales to Minors Spot Bill (reforming BPC S.26140). Currently nonsubstantive
AB 37	Jones-Sawyer/ "The Big 5"	CCIA sponsored. Allows cannabis businesses to deduct business-related expenses from their personal income tax. AKA, exempts cannabis businesses from 280E.
AB 127	Lackey	Exempts individuals who drive under the influence of a drug, or combined influence of alcohol and a drug, from being charged with a crime if they are conducting research on impaired driving on CHP premises.
AB 141	Cooper	Allows licensed retailers and manufacturers to host or participate in training/educational events for state and local government officials and employees without obtaining a temporary event license.
AB 147	Burke	Would specify that a retailer engaged in business in this state includes any retailer that, in the preceding calendar year or the current calendar year, has a cumulative sales price from the sale of tangible personal property for delivery in this state that exceeds \$500,000.
AB 228	Aguiar-Curry	Would state that a food, beverage, or cosmetic is not adulterated by the inclusion of industrial hemp products, including CBD derived from industrial hemp, and would prohibit restrictions on the sale of food, beverages, or cosmetics that include industrial hemp products or CBD derived from industrial hemp based solely on the inclusion of industrial hemp products or CBD.
AB 286	Bonta/"The Big 5"	Reduces excise tax from 15% to 11%, and eliminates the cultivation tax, until January 1, 2023.
AB 397	Chau	Recasts current DUI provisions to make driving under the influence of cannabis, or driving under the combined influence of cannabis and another drug, each a separate offense, but with no changes to the penalty

AB 404	Mark Stone	Allows cannabis testing laboratories to amend COAs to correct minor errors, as determined by the BCC.
AB 420	Lackey/Cooley/Wood	Specifies that the UC cannabis research program is hosted by the Center for Medicinal Cannabis Research. Also authorizes the program to cultivate cannabis for its use in research, as specified.
AB 545	Low	This bill would require the powers and duties of the BCC and the Cannabis Control Appeals Panel to be subject to review by the appropriate policy committees of the Legislature and would require the review to be performed as if MAUCRSA were scheduled to be repealed as of January 1, 2021
AB 717	Nazarian	Requires a state agency, in consultation with the Treasurer's Office, to contract with an armored car service provider to pickup, count, and transport cash remits of any state-imposed taxes and fees that are administered by that state agency from participating businesses
AB 833	Lackey	Authorizes BCC to establish additional security requirements for vehicles carrying \$1,000,000 or more of cannabis, cannabis products, cash, or a combination of those
AB 858	Levine	Creates the Emerald Triangle Sun-Grown Cannabis Commission. For outdoor cultivation authorized by a Type 1C license, requires the licensing authority to determine a maximum threshold of 2,500 square feet or less of total canopy size, with the option to meet an alternative maximum threshold to be determined by the licensing authority of up to 25 mature plants.
AB 953	Ting	Allows the legislative body of a city or the board of supervisors of a county to determine and implement a method by which a licensee under MAUCRSA may remit any city or county cannabis license tax amounts due by payment using stablecoins
AB 1085	McCarty	Cannabis education funds; creates a codified method for AUMA youth prevention/treatment funds to be used

AB 1288	Cooley	Requires the information captured by the track and trace program to additionally include the date of retail sale to a customer and whether the sale is on the retail premises or by delivery; also requires that track and trace is fully integrated into CLETS by July 1, 2020
AB 1291	Jones-Sawyer	Requires, if an applicant with 20 or more employees has not already entered into a labor peace agreement, the applicant to provide a statement that the applicant will enter a labor peace agreement within 60 days of employing 20 employees
AB 1296	Gonzalez	Establishes the Tax Recovery in the Underground Economy Criminal Enforcement Program in the Department of Justice to combat underground economic activities through a multiagency collaboration
AB 1356	Ting	Delays MAUCRSA reporting requirements to March 30, 2023 (potential spot)
AB 1417	Rubio, Blanca	Licensing spot bill
AB 1420	Obernolte	Establishes application and license fee ceilings that agencies must adhere to, consistent with adopted regulations.
AB 1458	Quirk	Testing lab spot bill/clean up
AB 1461	Quirk	Testing lab spot bill
AB 1470	Quirk	Packaging spot bill
AB 1525	Jones-Sawyer	"Banking safe haven"; provides that a financial institution providing services to cannabis businesses are not in violation of state law; authorizes licensing agencies to transmit track and trace info to said financial institution
AB 1530	Cooley	Prohibits delivery into banned jurisdictions; establishes a competitive grant program to assist localities with enforcement against illicit cannabis activities
AB 1569	Jones-Sawyer	Licensing authorities spot bill (likely a bill to make cannabis more accessible for veterans)
AB 1678	Carillo	General cannabis spot bill

AB 1710	Wood	General cannabis spot bill, pertaining to small businesses
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SB-34	Wiener	Allows for the donation of cannabis products to medicinal cannabis patients (compassionate care)
SB-51	Hertzberg	Provides for the licensure and regulation of cannabis limited charter banks and credit unions for the purpose of providing banking services to cannabis businesses
SB-67	McGuire	Requires, until Jan. 1 2020, a temporary license to remain valid if the licensee submitted an application for an annual license before their temporary license expired and the application is pending for a specified reason. Temporary licenses remain valid until applications are approved, denied, or disqualified. Requires licensing agencies to report to the Legislature every 30 days.
SB-153	Wilk	Hemp spot bill
SB-185	McGuire	This bill, for purposes of marks for which a certificate of registration is issued on or after January 1, 2020, would authorize the use of specified classifications for marks related to cannabis, including medicinal cannabis, goods and services that are lawfully in commerce under state law.
SB-203	Bradford	Public bank spot bill
SB-223	Hill	Jojo's Act; would authorize schools to adopt a policy that allows a parent/guardian of a pupil who is a medicinal cannabis patient to possess and administer medicinal cannabis, excluding cannabis in a smokeable or vapeable form, at a schoolsite.
SB-305	Hueso	Requires a healthcare facility to allow a patient who is receiving palliative care to use medical cannabis within the healthcare facility, subject to certain restrictions.
SB-475	Skinner	Would prohibit the sale of cannabis or a cannabis product that is designated a trade sample, but would allow those trade samples to be given for no consideration to an employee of the licensee that designated the trade sample or to another licensee

SB 527	Caballero	Authorizes that, unless otherwise noted by a board or council, certain types of cannabis cultivation are compatible uses of land under The Williamson Act
SB 581	Caballero	Requires licensing authorities to post on their internet websites certain information regarding an applicant or a licensee. The bill would authorize the licensing authorities to disclose this information by linking to original documents
SB 595	Bradford	Local equity spot bill
SB 625	Hill	Exempts the ingestion of cannabis products by a passenger in bus, taxicab, or limousine only if there are no passengers under 21 years of age present and the driver is sealed off from the passenger compartment, as specified.
SB 627	Galgiani	Allows veterinarians who complete a qualifying continuing education program to discuss and recommend medicinal cannabis products for patients
SB 657	Monning	Provides that a county agricultural commissioner may include cannabis produced in the county in a CDFR report, as an addendum to the report.
SB 658	Bradford	Cannabis equity act spot
SB 684	Umberg	Authorizes CHP to establish a pilot program in 3 cities in 3 separate counties to fund the testing of drivers suspected of driving under the influence of cannabis, as specified.
